**Question**: Should a wife work outside the home?

**Answer:** Each family is different and has different needs and therefore the family must look at what values they cherish and what is important to them.

When we look at the issue of a wife working outside the home, at first glance it seems natural and many wives do work. But if we take a closer look at the big picture, and all the different needs of family life, what do we see? We find that it can actually be detrimental to the family as a whole for a wife and mother to work outside the home.
